

Abby wanted me to take a picture of Basil to show her friends at nursery - she's all set on him joining her there so keep an eye out for any furry new 'children' getting snuck in!



As Aakav was sharing I thought it would be a good idea to use the 'My Family' cards so that Abri could get a sense of what we were discussing and get to know the other children. Abri was then able to use the cards herself to show us that she has a mum, dad and a little sister. We then pointed out to her that this is just like Aakav and Ben who also have younger siblings. She said, "yes, like me".

Amelie, Malih, Sosi and Becky shared that they have dogs and all of their dogs love to catch a ball. Amelie shared that she likes to bounce the ball really hard so that it goes up high and then Luna, her dog can catch it in her mouth.

We then decided we could explore bouncing different objects on a variety of surfaces to see what would happen. We found out that a beanbag doesn't bounce at all and that a bouncy ball bounces a lot. There was lots of laughter whilst we watched the bouncy ball bounce around outside and none of us could catch it!

She safely navigated the creative resources boxes, carefully opening and closing the larger wooden boxes in the corner, all of which are locked with a key.

We added the keys in as an extra challenge for the children!

Abby carefully folded and cut paper for the ears, using googly eyes and pipe cleaners for the whiskers. She had a go at threading beads onto the pipe cleaners, persevering when it got a little tricky, to make their whiskers "pretty". It turned out brilliantly!







Today we used an abacus to practise counting!

Firstly, we learnt how to use the abacus, moving the beads back and noticing that some were different colours - this will help us when practicing those mathematical skills!

I then moved 5 beads to one side and asked Leah to count how many beads I'd just moved to that side. Leah counted using her finger to count each bead - "One, two, three, four, five green beads!".

I then asked Leah to count how many beads were on the other side - "one, two, three, four, five red beads on that side too." she said.

Next, I asked Leah to push them together and count how many beads there were all together - "One, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten... there are ten beads together!".

We also noticed that when five and five come together they make ten.

We will continue practising some more mathematical skills like this to build Leah's counting skills and understanding of addition.
