
Memo


Using Tapestry for...

Report

Sally and the other children used lots of communication during their mud play day, and learnt a lot about the outdoors while they were there. Amir records the narrative on Sally's next report. Once the report is

published, Sally's parents viewed this on their Tapestry account and added their own voice to it using the comments section




Parent Observation

Sally's parents take her out to the park over the weekend, so that she can play in the puddles. They talked a lot about water and where rain comes from! Sally's parents add their own observation

as a reply to the 'Puddles' activity, to show Amir what they got up to



Sally's key person, Amir, adds a
General Log entry to her Care Diary
record to tell her parents that he
needed to clean her face
after play, and how he did that



Activity

The children learnt a lot during their mud play day; to carry on this learning whilst the children are at home, staff add the Activity 'Puddles', to encourage families to take their children outside and play in the puddles during this rainy weather
